Ted Lindsay Vitals

- Date of birth – July 29th, 1925 (Age 84)
- Place of birth – Renfrew, Ontario
- Height – 5'8"
- Weight – 168
- Shoots – Left
- Position – Left Wing
- Signed as a free agent by Detroit, on October 18, 1942, from the St. Michael's Majors, who had loaned him to the Oshawa Generals for the 1943-44 Memorial Cup, which was won by the Generals
- 17 seasons (Detroit Red Wings – 14, Chicago Blackhawks – 3)
- Games Played – 1,068
- Goals – 379 (season high of 33 in 1947-48)
- Assists – 472 (season high of 55 in 1949-50, 1956-57)
- Points – 851 (season high of 85 in 1956-57)
- PIM – 1,808
- Stanley Cups – Won four with the Red Wings (1949-50, 1951-52, 1953-54, 1954-55)
- Art Ross Trophy winner (1949-50)
- 8-time First Team All-Star (1948, 1950, 1951, 1952, 1953, 1954, 1956, 1957)
- Elected to Hockey Hall of Fame (1966)
- #7 jersey retired (Detroit Red Wings – 1991)
